Dear President James and Honorable Commissioners:

The Federation of Hillside and Canyon Associations, Inc., founded in 1952, represents 42 homeowner and resident associations with approximately 250,000 constituents spanning the Santa Monica Mountains. At its meeting of July 18, 2018, the Hillside Federation voted to urge the Board of Public Works to consider requiring the analysis of a polyphagous shot hole borer ("PSHB") expert before approving the proposed extensive tree removal at 10768 West Bellagio Road. The Federation also asserts that a Categorical Exemption is an inappropriate environmental document for a project with obvious significant impacts to 85 trees, including almost two dozen protected trees, and with impacts to more than 260 trees.

Subsequent to the Federation's action but before the City approved the removals, the applicant and City both admitted the applicant had already removed the vast majority of trees associated with the project without first obtaining the required permits. This is highly unusual and clearly improper, particularly where no determination on the adequacy of the proffered Categorical Exemption has been made by any City agency.

As our letter of August 24 noted (regarding the former case number), community members identified numerous shortcomings in the proposal and project documents. In light of the admitted illegal removals and failure to follow the process mandated by the Los Angeles Municipal Code, the Board of Public Works must consider available remedies to compensate the community for the harm caused by the improper tree removals.
