Re: Request for Formal Action Mandating Compliance with Burbank Airport Standard Instrument Departure Procedures

Dear Ms. Girvin:

The Federation of Hillside and Canyon Associations, Inc., founded in 1952, represents 43 homeowner and resident associations with approximately 250,000 constituents spanning the Santa Monica Mountains. Many of these constituents are directly impacted by the southerly shift of the current improper and illegal departure tracks from Burbank Airport. At its meeting of November 19, 2019, the Hillside Federation voted to join the City of Los Angeles in requesting formal action by the FAA to eliminate the southern shift of departing flights and to return to the flight tracks established before the Metroplex project.

The new flight tracks impact the Santa Monica Mountains, a precious and irreplaceable asset that includes parkland, threatened natural habitat and wildlife. Noise and air pollution from aircraft are exacerbated in terrain where aircraft are closer to the ground.

As Los Angeles City Attorney Michael N. Feuer noted in his letter of October 18, 2019, the FAA has acknowledged that FAA air traffic controllers are directing pilots departing Burbank Airport away from pre-Metroplex flight tracks that were to remain unchanged. This shift was never subject to public notice, comment, or environmental review. Since no additional formal review is required to follow already established procedures, City Attorney Feuer's letter suggests that the FAA may correct the illegal systematic flight path shift by implementing a Tower Order, Standard Operating Procedure, or similar interagency directive.

The Federation agrees with City Attorney Feuer's assessment and, noting that six weeks have passed since his letter, urges the FAA to take immediate action to reinstate the legally established flight paths.
