# Hillside Federation April 25, 2017 Minutes

#### I. Call to Order

Sen. Ben Allen is on Education and Transportation Committees and the environmental caucus. SB 1 – Gas Tax, SB 50 Public Lands Protection Act.

"The Knoll" in Runyon Canyon Park has been purchased and added to the park. It was previously private property but is now protected forever. There will be a celebration August 10<sup>th</sup>.

AB 1350 addresses Affordable Housing. Steve Twining asked about SB 1818 enforcement. George Abrahams wants the ELDP component of CEQA eliminated.

Guest: Angie Aramayo, Assemblymember Nazarian's office

Nazarian is hosting a Senior Scam Prevention Clinic.

AB 25 Tour Bus Regulation would require CHP safety checks of modified vans, community safety; limiting hours, noise. Local cities could ban tour buses from certain streets. Considering traffic and safety as the main issues.

→MOTION: Don Andres moved that the Federation write a letter to support AB 25. The motion passed.

# III. Officers' Reports

#### A. President's Report

The Hannah Carter Japanese Garden Historic-Cultural Monument nomination has been approved by PLUM.

The P-22 documentary, "The Cat that Changed America" may have a screening at the LA Zoo.

Marian Dodge attended the memorial service for Chair Emeritus Gordon Murley.

Marian announced the Public Access to Public Parks rally on April 15 and the Fish and Game Commission meeting in Van Nuys on April 26.

# B. Treasurer's Report - Don Andres

Thirty-seven member organizations have paid their dues. Balances were reported, taxes are filed, and Secretary of State filing has been submitted.

#### **IV. Old Business**

# A. Accessory Dwelling Units - Charley Mims

The version that came out of PLUM is worse than an earlier version. The hillside definition needs to be modified and hillside areas need to be exempt. The Federation will send a sample letter to our members and ask them to submit letters.

#### B. Curtis School - Mark Stratton

The Federation met with Curtis school officials twice. They have dropped the 3<sup>rd</sup> access road across Caltrans property from their plans. This is a huge victory.

# C. Baseline Hillside Ordinance - Marian Dodge

The amendments have been approved, but we need to submit changes in how institutions are regulated. Tom Freeman noted that institutions operate under a CUP. They should have to get a variance for over-inheight buildings which requires proving necessity.

<u>Sign Ordinance</u> - PLUM continues to ask the Planning Department for reports on signs outside Sign Districts and signs on city property. PLUM is pro signs.

### D. Studio City Golf & Tennis project - Alan Dymond

The new proposal at Weddington Golf and Tennis is for 200+ condos, which would require a zoning change from agricultural.

→MOTION: Alan Dymond moved that the Federation oppose the up-zoning of the property and authorize the use of the Hillside Federation logo on a letter to Councilmember Krekorian with logos of other organizations that are opposed to the Weddington condo project. Passed.

#### **IV. New Business**

Steve Twining – The new <u>Bel Air Construction Overlay</u> has many restrictions for projects over 17,500 square feet: limited working hours, specifics on hauling truck sizes and other things.

Stephen Benson –  $\underline{10580 \text{ Selkirk}}$ , in Beverly Glen. The large retaining walls were approved by the West APC in March. Now they are waiting for the geological survey and haul plans to address the next steps.
