Dear Councilmembers:

The Federation of Hillside and Canyon Associations, Inc., founded in 1952, represents thirty-seven homeowner and residents associations spanning the Santa Monica Mountains, from Pacific Palisades to Mt. Washington. The Federation's mission is to protect the property and the quality of life of its over 200,000 constituents and to conserve the natural habitat and appearance of the hillside and mountain areas in which they live. Therefore the Hillside Federation supports the Hollywood Community Plan.

The Federation worked for many months with the Planning Department to design the Baseline Hillside Ordinance and Slope Density Ordinance which allow for appropriate development in our hillsides while retaining as much of the natural topography as possible. These two ordinances were carefully crafted to balance the needs of the builder and the needs of wildlife habitat.

Equally important to the plan is the inclusion of the Ridgeline Protection Ordinance and the Retaining Wall Ordinance currently being prepared by the Planning Department. The Ridgeline Ordinance will preserve the ecology and the classic profile of the Santa Monica Mountains. The Retaining Wall Ordinance will provide a greater variety of options than the current restrictive ordinance. These options will both reduce the amount of grading required and produce more aesthetically pleasing walls.

That said, the Federation would like to continue to work with the Planning Department. Let's take a peek at those pesky population projections and see if we can come up with some more realistic numbers.
