Re: City Council Motion #14-0331, Solar Rights Act Amendment and DWP Notice

Dear City Councilmembers:

The Federation of Hillside and Canyon Associations, Inc., founded in 1952, represents 44 homeowner and residents associations spanning the Santa Monica Mountains, from Pacific Palisades to Mt. Washington. The Federation's mission is to protect the property and quality of life of its over 200,000 constituents and to conserve the natural habitat and appearance of the hillside and mountain areas in which they live. At its May 2014 meeting, the Federation voted unanimously to support City Council Motion No. 14-0331 concerning the need for environmental protection against the impacts of solar power generating projects in residential areas and broader public notice of such projects and their impacts.

The motion (1) recommends that the State Legislature amend the California Solar Rights Act of 1978 to authorize local governments to exercise discretionary review of solar power generating projects and (2) requires the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (DWP) to report back to the Council on its efforts to adequately inform local communities of solar projects planned for residential areas and the potential environmental impacts of such projects. While the Federation strongly supports the development of solar energy, the Solar Rights Act must be amended to confer on local governments the basic discretionary authority to protect local communities, the environment, and wildlife when such power-generating projects would constitute non-conforming uses or otherwise violate zoning restrictions.

The Federation is also concerned that DWP has apparently refused to reveal the locations of the solar projects that have been accepted into its Feed-in-Tariff (FiT)Program, even where such projects would be located in residential areas such as the Equine keeping District in Lake View Terrace adjacent to the National Forest Foothills. Public notice is essential for such potentially impactful projects, especially those planned for environmentally sensitive areas like the National Forest Foothills and the Santa Monica Mountains.

The Hillside Federation therefore strongly supports Council Motion No. 14-0331 and urges the City Council to pursue the legislation necessary to assure that local governments are granted the authority to subject solar power generating projects to normal planning and environmental review procedures whenever such projects are planned for residential or other areas where such land use activities do not conform to existing zoning requirements.
